MARTA Atlanta's Rapid Transit

Riding MARTA, Atlanta's rapid transit system, from the airport to your downtown hotel is easy. Participants will go to the Domestic Terminal, between the North and South baggage claims. Take the Red and Gold lines to the downtown convention district and depart at the station nearest your hotel.

Tips for taking MARTA to and from Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport:

- MARTA's Airport Station is *inside* the Domestic Terminal. Travel to the Domestic Terminal, between the North and South baggage claims. Here is the domestic terminal directory: bit.ly/MARTA-TermMap
- **Take the Red or Gold lines.** They travel directly to and from the Airport Station.

- **MARTA's fare system uses Breeze Cards.** Purchase cards at www.BreezeCard.com ahead of time, at the Breeze Vending Machines in any MARTA rail stations or in person at the Marta Ridestore in the Airport or Five Points stations.
 - A reloadable Breeze Card is \$2 and then \$2.50 for a one-way trip.
 - A Breeze ticket is \$1 plus the \$2.50 fare for a one-way trip.

SkillsUSA LEARN is comprised of six tracks:

- **Student Development** - for students to develop their personal, workplace, and technical skills
- **Student Credentialing** - for students to earn industry-recognized credentials
- **CTE Instructor Innovation and Development** - for instructors to improve instruction
- **Advisor Development** - for advisors to develop chapters
- **Advisor/Instructor Credentialing** (non-licensure) - for educators to earn or be able to administer industry-recognized credentials
- **CTE Administrator/Leadership Development** - for local school administrators

All required online test(s) must be completed by 5 p.m. ET on Friday, May 22, 2026.***

Online Submission Requirements

SkillsUSA Championships national competitors must complete their online submission(s) by May 22 2026, at 5 p.m. ET. The upload(s) will be completed via SkillsUSA's secure platform which will open in early May 2026. Check the current SkillsUSA Technical Standards for your competition to learn about any required national pre-conference online submissions.

SkillsUSA Winners List and Winners Photos

SkillsUSA will announce winners on Friday night at the Awards Session, provide lists of winners to SkillsUSA state directors and then post winners on the SkillsUSA website immediately after NLSC. In addition, detailed scores will be posted on the SkillsUSA website by **August 1** and these can be located using your contestant number and birthdate.

SkillsUSA will post winners' photos on the website after the national conference. These downloadable photos are taken backstage of all medalists as they go to collect their prizes.

CODE OF CONDUCT

As a student and advisor of the SkillsUSA Organization the Code of Conduct must be followed. If anyone violates the Code of Conduct, they will be dismissed from the conference immediately. If traveling with a school group (High School), the individual parents will be notified and will be sent home at their own expense. If a postsecondary student/advisor, they will be sent home and be responsible for their own expenses. These rules are in place to give everyone a pleasant and safe experience during the national conference. Every student and advisor attending the national conference must sign the Code of Conduct Agreement and submit it to their lead advisor who is attending the conference. The advisor is responsible for having this with them during NLSC in case something happens and we need to dismiss a student.

EMERGENCY DATA FORM

This form must be completed and kept on all attendees while at NLSC. Please put this inside your name badge so if any accident happens, then the appropriate information is on your person.

***Both of the below forms MUST be brought to NLSC with you. The Code of Conduct will need to be given to your adult chaperon who is on site while at NLSC and who the Kansas Office would be calling if there would be an emergency. The Emergency Data Form needs be carried in your name badge at all times while at NLSC.

Code of Conduct Agreement

SkillsUSA activities are designed to be an educational function, and all plans are made with that objective. The activities offered by the SkillsUSA Organization may have thousands of students attending from all over the nation. It is an approved major education activity by the Kansas Board of Education, the Kansas Board of Regents, The National Association of Secondary Principals and the Association for Skilled and Technical Sciences. SkillsUSA wants every person to have an enjoyable experience with every attention paid to safety and comfort. All participants will be expected to conduct themselves in a manner best presenting SkillsUSA as the nation's greatest student organization.

For everyone to receive the maximum benefits from participation, SkillsUSA's "Code of Conduct," as established by the national board of directors, must be always followed. Note that attendance is not mandatory. By voluntarily participating, you agree to follow the official conference rules and regulations or forfeit your personal rights to participate. SkillsUSA is proud of its students and knows that by signing the "Code of Conduct" you are simply reaffirming your dedication to be the best possible representative of your State.

<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. I will, always, respect all public and private property, including the hotel/motel in which I am housed.2. I will spend each night in the room of the hotel/motel to which I am assigned.3. I will strictly abide by the curfew established and shall respect the rights of others by being as quiet as possible after curfew.4. I will not enter any hotel room other than the one to which I am assigned. I understand that I am assigned a hotel room for the sole purpose of overnight accommodation.5. I will not leave the hotel/motel without the express permission of my advisor or state SkillsUSA director. Should I receive permission, I will leave a written notice of where I will be.6. I will not use alcoholic beverages. I will not use drugs unless I have been ordered to take certain prescription medications by a license's physician. If I am required to take medication, I will, always, have the orders of the physician on my person.7. I will not have in my possession any firearms, dangerous weapons, explosive compound, or an object that can reasonably be considered and/or used as a weapon.	<ol style="list-style-type: none">8. My conduct shall be always exemplary.9. I will not engage in bullying, which includes hazing; menacing; taunting; intimidating; the use of lewd, profane or vulgar language; verbal or physical abuse of other; or other threatening behavior toward others in person or through acts of cyberbullying.10. I will respect official SkillsUSA attire and not smoke while wearing it.14. I will attend and be on time for all general sessions and activities that I am assigned to and registered for.15. I will adhere to the dress code at all required times.
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Violations and Penalties

I agree that if, for any reason, I am in violation of any of the rules, I may be brought before the appropriate disciplinary committee for an analysis of the violation. I also agree to accept the penalty imposed on me. I understand that any penalty and reasons for it will be explained to me before it is carried out. I further realize that the severity of violation, even to the extent of being immediately sent home at my own expense.

1. Violations of Items 1 through 6 of the "Code of Conduct" will be grounds for immediate removal from office and relinquishment of awards and recognition. In addition, the violator will be sent home at his or her own expense. Notification of the violation and the action taken will be sent to the participant's school and parents or guardians. The participant's misconduct or infraction could result in the disqualifying of his or her schools or state delegation as well.
2. Violations of Items 7 through 12 will result in a warning and reprimand. Notification of the violation and the action taken will be sent to the participant's school administrator and parents or guardians. Repeated violations of Items 7 through 12 may result in the participant being sent home at his/her own expense.
